
- Singing and chanting lots of camp songs

Time Off


All camp staff are off Friday evening to Sunday afternoon (roughly 6pm Friday to 1pm Sunday), 2 hrs each full day of work and one night off per week (start of dinner to 12am). You are welcome to stay on camp during your time off or leave with your own transportation.

Camp staff are welcome to stay over the weekends at camp or head out for the weekend. Staff are break or whom stay over the weekend are permitted to do camp activities (sailing, kayaking, archery, etc.) with a buddy and the required facilitators. GSCB will provide transportation into town to Walmart on Friday evening for anyone staying on camp.
