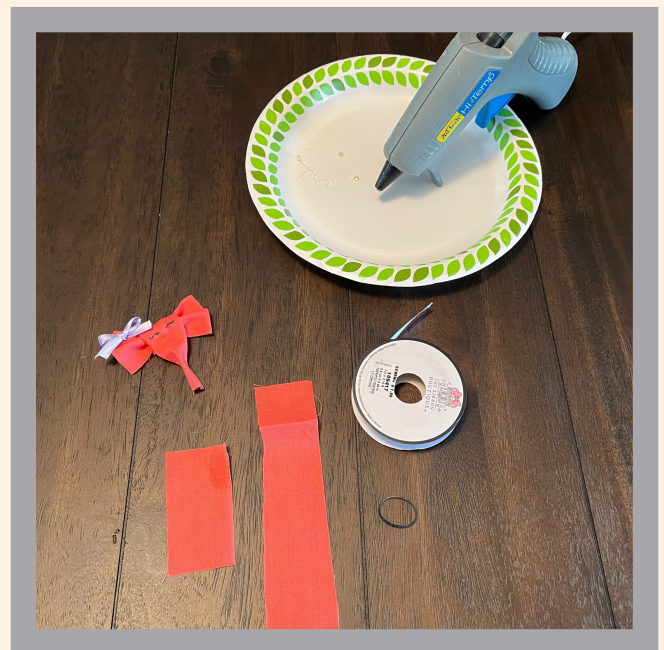




Elephant Swap

Materials

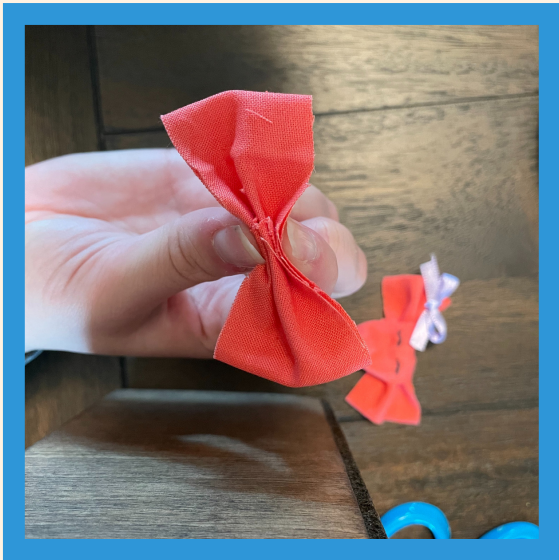
- 1 inch thick ribbon or fabric (2 strips - 6 inches and 3 inches)
- Small elastic band
- Glue (hot glue recommended)
- Scissors
- Marker or googly eyes
- 3 inch strip of 1/4 inch thick ribbon (optional)



Steps

- Step 1: Cut 2 pieces of fabric or ribbon, 1 inch thick. One piece should be 6 inches, the other should be 3 inches.
- Step 2: Fold your 6-inch strip so that the ends overlap in the back, about 1/2 inch

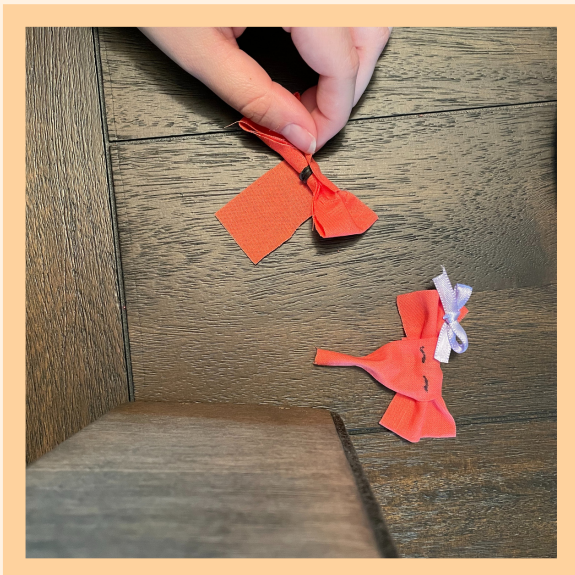




- Step 3: Pinch the overlapped pieces together to form a bow shape. Make sure your ends are folded inwards towards you.



- Step 4: Wrap your elastic band around the center of your bow to secure.



- Step 5: Wrap your 3-inch strip around the center of your bow and glue the end to the back (right over the elastic band).

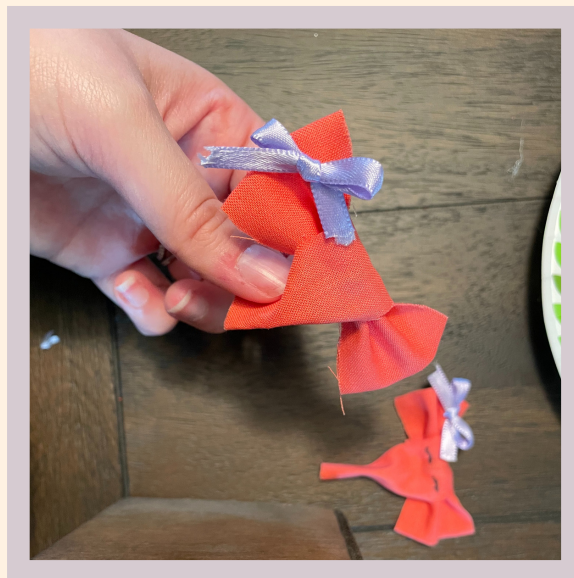


- Step 6: Flip it over the front and glue the at the same spot on the front (You should have a longer piece hanging down in the front for the trunk).





- Step 7: Pinch the trunk in half and place a dot of glue in between to secure.



- Step 8 (optional): Use your $\frac{1}{4}$ ribbon to make a small bow. Glue the bow to the corner of your elephants ear.



- Step 9: Draw or glue on your eyes.



- Step 10: If you are adding a safety pin, glue it to the back of the elephant



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
