Updates and Happenings

Is Your Troop Meeting GSUSA Requirements?

Here's a summary of what is required:

1. A Girl Scout troop/group must have at minimum five girls and two approved unrelated adult volunteers, at least one of whom is female (two Co-Leaders or one Co-Leader and one dedicated Troop Support Volunteer who acts to fulfill ratio).

However, adult to girl ratio varies with Program Level, number of girls and activity, so double-check the Troop Size and Knowing How Many Volunteers You Need sections of Troop Leader Central to make sure you've got the right amount of coverage for your troop.

GSUSA states a minimum of 5 youth members per troop.

Youth Mental Health First Aid Training

Volunteers and Adult Members are invited to participate in Blended Youth Mental Health First Aid Training which consists of a 2-hour self-paced online course and a 5.5 hour instructor-led virtual training.

Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges among children and adolescents ages 12-18. What Mental Health First Aid Covers:

- Common signs, symptoms of mental health challenges in this age group, including anxiety, depression, eating disorders and more.
- Common signs and symptoms of substance use challenges.
- How to interact with a child or adolescent in crisis.
- How to connect the youth with help.

Other

Survey Updates

We'll be transitioning the format of girl-facing surveys from standard questions to a prompt and video submission. There will also be an audio-only option if your family is not comfortable with video.

Why the change?

- 1. To empower girls to provide their own feedback independently of their caregivers.
- 2. This feature was recently made available by GSUSA and we're excited about it!
- 3. Survey vendor Qualtrics does the video analysis behind the scenes using keywords and themes. Reducing staff time spent evaluating surveys and identifying feedback trends.

Things to know:

- 1. Audio only is an alternative if there are privacy concerns.
- 2. Staff will not be conducting individual reviews of these submissions.
- 3. They will remain anonymous unless personal identification information is shared or worn in the video.
- 4. Staff access to survey data is limited to three persons with structured debrief presentations for staff at large.
- 5. Surveys impacted will be: all program, product program wrap up, Girl Scout Advisory Board Application, and others as reviewed and deemed appropriate
