Girl Scout Voices Count is a national survey of girls, parents/caregivers, and troop leaders conducted by Girl Scouts of the USA. Last year, nearly 100,000 members completed our annual Girl Scout Voices



Count survey to tell us about their experiences in Girl Scouts. Your feedback is used to make national programs more engaging, inclusive, and hands-on, and to create new resources to support troop leaders. Your voice matters and makes Girl Scouts better for everyone—so we want to hear from you!

**Troop Leaders, Caregivers and Girl Scouts** – your surveys were delivered via email the 2nd week of April and will close on May 7th, so be sure to look back in your inbox to complete this as soon as possible.

**Service Unit volunteers** – you should receive your surveys the week of May 8th and they will close on June 5th, so be on the lookout!

#### **Troop Travel Application**

Travelling with your Cookie proceeds soon? Don't forget to complete your <u>Troop Travel Application</u> if your troop will be:

- Staying overnight (For trips that are 3 nights or more or any day activities where non-Girl Scouts are attending, additional insurance is recommended but not required)
- High Risk Activities (as defined by the Safety Activity Checkpoints)
- Air Travel
- International Travel
- Girl, Troop or SU is partaking in a trip organized by another council or GSUSA

Remember that when you travel, your safety ratios change. Review the chart to the right and make sure you have enough registered, background checked volunteers to maintain safe girl-to-adult ratios.

#### **National Council Session Information**

#### • What is it?

The <u>Girl Scout Convention</u> week (July 18 – 25) begins with the 56th National Council Session (NCS), which is the national business meeting where delegates from every council across the nation and USA Girl Scouts Overseas meet to discuss, debate, and vote on issues important to the Girl Scout Movement, and elect national leaders for the next triennium. The business portion of the week is followed by Phenom by Girls Scouts, where Girl Scouts from all over can participate in the Hall of Experiences, a National Bridging Ceremony, and so much more!

#### Proposals National Delegates will vote on - ACTION NEEDED!

During this year's Triennial business meeting National Delegates from these regions will vote on seven proposals and discussion topics that are on the 56th National Council Session agenda. These proposals will impact all Girl Scout members.

Our councils' 4 National Council Delegates want to hear your thoughts on these proposals they will be voting on, so they can represent the voices of all of GSCB. Please take some time to review the 2023 National Council Session Proposals.

- Constitutional Amendment Allowing the possibility of virtual attendance for National Council Sessions and for Special Sessions of the National Council
- 2. Constitutional Amendment Formula for (National) Delegates
- 3. Constitutional Amendment Timing of Delegate Allotment
- 4. Constitutional Amendment Council Representation on the National Board
- 5. Constitutional Amendment Amend the Girl Scout Promise and Law to use more potent, actionable language
- 6. Constitutional Amendment DEIRJ Language Proposal
- 7. Discussion Girl Scouts Gold Award Scholarship Fund

#### Service Unit Delegate Appointment Process

As we plan for the 2023 – 2024 Membership Year, Service Unit Delegate elections have begun for the upcoming term. Service Unit delegates and alternate delegates serve as a member of the Corporation of the Girl Scouts of the Chesapeake Bay Council to communicate governance information between the board of directors and the service unit that elected them. Delegates and alternates represent the voice of the service unit to the Board of Directors at the Annual Meeting of the council.

#### Here are the steps to Elections:

- 1. Let your Service Unit Manager know if you are interested in being nominated for this role.
- 2. Service Unit Manager will facilitate a Service Unit Delegate election at a Leader Meeting in May or June.
  - a.  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the Service Units active troops must be represented at the election.
- 3. Service Unit submits their elected Delegates and Alternate Delegates using the <u>GSCB Service Unit Delegate Election Form</u> by June 30th, 2023.
