- Troop Product Program Champions, both Fall and Cookie, now have access to the full details of the My Troop Tab so that they have easy access to troop member information to use during their respective programs.
- GSCB has launched the VTK Finance Tab which will be utilized beginning October 1st to help troop track finances throughout the year, submit an annual Troop Finance Report, and support financial transparency between troop leaders and caregivers.
- Are you new to VTK? VTK is a digital resource that supports volunteers in delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience and Juliettes (individually registered girls) in managing their own experience with their caregiver, ensuring every Girl

Recruitment Readiness

As volunteers, you are an important part of getting more girls involved in Girl Scouts. By opening your troop to new girls, sharing your experience with Girl Scouts with your friends and family, volunteering to represent GSCB at local events, hosting your own recruitment events, etc., YOU are the key to a successful recruitment season.

- Sampler Troops A popular way to introduce Girl Scouts is to host a sampler troop. After a set number of meetings with both girls and caregivers, the goal of the sampler troop is to convert into a traditional troop. If successful, caregivers will step up to become troop volunteers after seeing the role demonstrated first hand, or GSCB and the volunteers running the sampler troop will have recruited other adults to lead the troop. - Recruitment Resources for Service Units:

Service Unit Lead Forms and QR Codes: To improve our follow up and placement of future Girls Scouts, each Service Unit has been issued their very own SU Lead form to capture information at recruitment events, as well as a QR Code image to include on flyers and signage at events! Data Quality

To support the migration to gsEvents and drive accuracy in our troop data, we'll be making changes to troop accounts related to grades accepted. Any troop who previously had grades accepted that differed from the current grades of their troop members have been pulled into alignment to only reflect the grades of their current members.

Why? Being open to this many levels can be misleading to prospective members searching

for a troop. Additionally, gsEvents is structured, by GSUSA, to only show events applicable to the levels of your troop and household members. Therefore, by having only Brownies but being listed as accepting grades K-3, you would also see Daisy events – creating noise in your event searches and giving a false impression of events available for registration. You are still able to see all events via the events calendar on our website or in gsEvents when you are not actively logged in to your myGS.

This change gives us a clearer picture of our troops and supports more intentional recruitment efforts and thoughtful placement of Girl Scouts.

If your troop was affected by this, we have not lost your commitment to making Girl Scouts available to all girls and have captured elsewhere on your troop profile that you are open to girl members at other levels not currently in your troop.

GSCB Board Approved Recognitions

Board Approved Recognitions are an esteemed way to recognize your peers that leave you in awe. Volunteers nominated for these recognitions are gamechangers, not just for their Troops but also for their Service Unit and maybe neighboring Service Unit(s) too!

- Review the recognitions and understand their requirements using the <u>GSCB Volunteer</u> <u>Appreciation and Recognition Handbook</u>.
- Submit nominations through the <u>GSCB Board Approved Recognition Nomination Form</u>.
- Submit required endorsements through the <u>GSCB Board Approved Recognition</u> <u>Endorsement Form</u>.

All nominations and endorsements are due by December 31, 2023.

Seeing the involvement of thousands of girls, hearing stories of their accomplishments and community impact, and sharing stories about swaps, really proved to me that everyone has a place in Girl Scouts, and how important it is for us to keep supporting the movement."

Tracie Bruno: "The 56th National Council Session has ended, but the memories,

and inspirational moments are with me forever. The democratic process was fully utilized, where each delegate had an opportunity to speak and be heard, before we came together as a group to vote on proposals. I was especially impressed with the girl delegates, who were a little reserved at the beginning of the session but were full of confidence and passion as the spoke on proposals that were dear to their hearts. While the business was serious, the breaks allowed us to meet Girl Scouts from across the world, exchange swaps and stories, and feel pride in being part of the Girl Scout movement."

I was so impressed with the girl delegates and how they spoke and handled themselves in a room of 900 people! I really enjoyed talking to other volunteers from around the world. It was a great experience that I would love to repeat!"

Heather Burket: "The National Council Session was a heartwarming and motivating experience to be a part of. I witnessed Girl Scouts of all ages participating in leadership opportunities at developmentally appropriate levels and experienced the opportunity to see public speaking skills flourish in the teen delegates whom felt passionate enough to represent their and their councils beliefs

about the proposals for change. It was exciting and sometimes daunting to see parliamentary procedure at work, but it was effective and most left the meetings content with the fairness of our collective decisions. I was also motivated and comforted after meeting and speaking with some of the incoming board of directors and leadership of GSUSA. I had the pleasure of participating in some Girl Scout fellowship and traditions during Phenom and NCS that brought feelings of positive GS nostalgia to me, which were extra special while shared with my daughter, a 3rd grade Brownie who also attended Phenom for a day. Both my daughter and I came home invigorated for the new GS season, with ideas to share with our troop.
