

Troop Camp Packing List

When troops go camping, there are items each individual needs to bring and items the troop will need to bring. Here is a list to help you make sure that everyone has everything they will need. We recommend packing your items in a large backpack or a duffle bag, as camp is not the best place for suitcases.

Lodges have electricity, heat/air conditioning, running water, flushing toilets, showers, and mattress either in bunkbeds or on the floor. Rustic Adirondacks or canvas tent units have small sleeping units of four in cots or wooden bunk beds.

For the Troop

For troops staying in a modern unit, you will only have to pack for your personal needs. Most lodges are fully equipped with cooking, equipment, supplies, and other necessities.

Don't worry about buying all this yourself – shop secondhand stores and ask your troop families to check at home for extra items they could donate!
