

Catch the Llama Tail Game

Ready for a game that will have Girl Scouts of any age giggling? Play “Catch the Llama Tail” in a large space (preferably outside, on grass).

How to Play

1. All Girl Scouts get into one large line and hold hands. Decide which end will be the llama’s “head” and which one will be the llama’s “tail”.
2. The game begins and the Girl Scout at the “head” of the llama tries to touch the Girl Scout at the “tail” of the llama. Here’s the catch - no Girl Scouts can let go of each other hands!
3. The head of the llama will try to move around the other Girl Scouts while the tail will try to hid behind.
4. If the tail of the llama is caught, the head of the llama goes to the back of the line and becomes the tail. The next girl in the front becomes the head.
5. Repeat until everyone has had a turn being the head and the tail.

Llama Herding Game

You’ll have a whole llama fun playing this game! To play, we recommend two different color balloons (3 of each color, and extras in case balloons pop) that will represent the “llama’s”, two brooms, and four hula hoops. Inflate the balloons ahead of time.

How to Play

1. Separate Girl Scouts into two teams. Assign each team a color of balloon.
2. Each team lines up single-file at one end of the room. In front of each line, place a hula hoop and arrange the three balloons inside of it. At the opposite end of the room from each line, place the other hula hoops.
3. The first person in line must “herd” their three balloon llama’s from one hula hoop to the other, and back, using only the broom. They then hand off the broom to the next person in line.
4. The first team to have all players finishing herding their balloon llamas wins!
