

Troop Roster Checks

Do it now before you find Girl Scouts missing in eBudde!

It is important that Troop Leaders are checking their troop rosters NOW in myGS to ensure that all Girl Scouts who are participating in your troop this year are registered. This is to ensure that every Girl Scout has the opportunity to participate in the Cookie Program as well as to ensure that we have accurate records. Please contact MemberCare@cbgsc.org if you have any questions.

Financial Tracking and Resource Reminder

As we head into Cookie Season, it's a great time to be sure that your Troop's Financial Tracker is up to date! Here are some tips and reminders:

- The [GSCB Troop Financial Worksheet](#) should have your detailed finance recorded from 7/1/25 through today.
- **Best practice is to enter Cookie payments from caregivers and deposits from booths on separate lines in case you need to reference them at a later date.**
- **BE SURE TO WRITE RECEIPTS** to caregivers when giving cookies or receiving payments.
- Keep all receipts and financial records for 2 years in case a detailed audit is required.

If you haven't started tracking your troop finances using the [GSCB Troop Financial Worksheet](#), it's not too late! Start now so that you are ready for end of year submission next July. If you have questions, start by completing the gsLearn training titled: 200 GSCB Finance and Reporting Learning Path.

Digital Cookie

- The Digital Cookie website is live now.
- Digital Cookie App launches January 31st, 2026 (used for in-hand payments only once cookies arrive)

Initial Order (IO) Deadline

- **January 20th, 8AM** - Digital Cookie pauses for IO transfer to eBudde
- **January 20th, 11:59PM** - Troop Cookie Champions must submit Initial Order and Rewards in eBudde
- **January 21st, 11:59PM** - Service Unit Initial Orders and Rewards due

IMPORTANT:

- Do NOT duplicate Digital Cookie orders in paper/Initial Orders
- Submit Initial Order first, then Rewards (updates may take up to 20 minutes)
- Troops opting out of rewards still earn Initial Order rewards; opt out deadline is February 9th!

Digital Cookie Orders After IO

- Orders placed after January 20th (8:01 AM) require TCC assignment in eBudde for girl delivery and in-hand orders
- Payments transfer automatically. Cookie packages do not transfer automatically (with the exception of donations and direct shipping orders). See eBudde messages for more details.

Troop Digital Cookie Link

- TCCs should set up the Troop Link now for booths and in-hand payments
- Published troop links appear in the GSUSA Cookie Finder starting January 31st
- Booth distribution is easier using the *Booth Recorder function* in eBudde

Cookie Booth Selection

- Opens January 30th at 8:00PM in eBudde
- Limit: 3 booth slots per council-sponsored business through February 4th at 8:00AM
- After February 4th (8:01 AM), all booths open with no slot limit
- Previously selected booths remain unless released by the troop

Cookie Cupboards - Staff-Run Locations

- Locations:
 - **Hebron, MD** (Bates moving)
 - **Newark, DE** (American Van & Storage)
- Hours:
 - Both locations open **Fridays starting Feb. 6th 9AM - 4PM** (last pickup 3:45PM)

- Cupboard Reminders
 - Pending cupboard orders must be entered in eBudde **at least 1 hour before pickup**
 - Pickup person **must have their own eBudde login** (see Troop Pickup Only User Request Form for details)
 - Cookies are **not returnable** at any time

ACH (Automatic Clearing House) for Troops

- February 13th - TCCs are notified of amount due to council for 1st ACH
- February 16th - ACH Extension Request and Caregiver Debt Form deadlines
- February 20th - 1st ACH facilitated

Philanthropy Updates

- We are deeply grateful to Crystal Trust in Delaware for their generous grant of \$100,000 for critical repairs at Camp Country Center. Work has already begun. On January 13, 2026, we started repairing the rear deck of the STEM Lodge and expect this to be completed soon. Efforts also are moving forward to construct a new footbridge over the stream as well as develop a 2nd footbridge. Planning for additional repairs are underway.

Celebrate World Thinking Day!



What is World Thinking Day?

There's strength in the unity of Girl Scouts and Girl Guides around the globe, and on World Thinking Day, celebrated every February 22, we honor that mighty global sisterhood. The day is, of course, about more than just thinking: it's about taking action, knowing that every girl has the power to make a positive impact on her world. 2026 marks 100 years of World Thinking Day!

World Thinking Day is the perfect opportunity for you as a troop leader to get your girls to think big; you might learn some new things along the way too! By exploring meaningful issues beyond their local communities, girls cultivate the big-picture thinking, empathy, and determination that help them better connect to the world around them... and play major roles in making it better.

How you can celebrate with your troop:

1. **Explore the theme** - This year's special theme is Our Friendship. Celebrate the friendships that connect us all around the globe!
2. **Attend a World Thinking Day event** - Many Service Units plan World Thinking Day events. We encourage you to get in touch with your Service Unit Manager to find out if there's an event happening near you.
3. **Bring World Thinking Day to your troop** by encouraging Girl Scouts to think globabally, start a pen pal program with Girl Scouts from another country, discover the cultures, traditions, topography and wildlife of other countries, learn about issues that impact girls around the world, or invite a guest with a global perspective.
