Financial Tracking and Resource Reminder!

As we head into Cookie Season, it's a great time to be sure that your Troop's Financial Tracker is up to date! Here are some tips and reminders:

- The '24-'25 GSCB Troop Financial Worksheet should have your detailed finance recorded from $7\!/\!1\!/\!24$ through today.
- Best practice is to enter Cookie payments from caregivers and deposits from booths on separate lines in case you need to reference them at a later date
- BE SURE TO WRITE RECEIPTS to caregivers when giving cookies or receiving payments.

If you haven't started tracking your troop finances using the GSCB Troop Financial Worksheet, it's not too late! Start now so that you are ready for end of year submission next July. If you have questions, start by completing the gsLearn training titled: 200 GSCB Finance and Reporting Learning Path.

Digital Cookie & Digital Cookie App Updates

All Digital Cookie Users must set up their account on the <u>Digital Cookie website</u>. The Digital Cookie app is meant for payments and users cannot set up their Digital Cookie account in the App. The Digital Cookie app is not accessible until February 1, 2025, when girls/troops have cookies in-hand/ inventory.

Digital Cookie for volunteers with completed role requirements will be accessible to set up starting December 16, 2024.

Digital Cookie for caregivers with completed girl requirements will be accessible to set up starting December 18, 2024. The email will be sent to the primary email address on their membership account for all users.

Please make sure you check/update your email address on your membership account so that the correct email address is used for access.

Southern Staff-Led Cupboard

GSCB has identified a cupboard in the southern portion of our council. Bates Moving and Storage (27120 Ocean Gateway, Hebron, MD) has agreed to host it. Soon, all information pertaining to the cupboard will be located in eBudde.

Reminder about Troop Proceeds

Troop Proceeds, Simplified: We have restructured our troop proceeds to make things simpler and rewarding for the 2025 Cookie Program.

Troops will now earn a base proceed of \$.75 per package sold.

Troops that achieve a per girl average (PGA) of 325+ packages, per girl **selling**, will earn an additional \$.15 per package sold (eBudde calculates this automatically). This is referred to as a bonus proceed for high achievement.

Junior through Ambassador troops that choose to opt out of rewards will receive an additional \$.05 per package sold.

PGA is ALWAYS based on Girl Selling. Girls who do not have sales added to their girl orders in eBudde do not count towards troop PGA.

Troop Packages (pkgs) Sold	Troop Proceed	Older Girl Troop Opt-Out Tier
Base proceed for each pkg sold	\$0.75	\$0.80
325+ final troop PGA pkgs sold	\$0.90	\$0.95

Rewards Opt-Out

Junior, Cadette, Senior, and Ambassador troops can elect to opt-out of rewards and earn an additional \$.05 proceed on top of the base proceed tier earned by the troop. Multi-level troops that have girls younger than Juniors are not eligible to opt out.

Opting Out of rewards should be completed by the Troop Cookie Champion in eBudde. Please remember that GSCB will not refund a troop if they did not opt out before the submission or lockout deadlines. Troops that opt-out of rewards still receive Initial Order rewards, patches, and the higher-level, non-LBB rewards (such as Cookie Dough). Non-LBB rewards start at the 1250+ level during the 2025 program. Charms do not qualify as part of the opt-out rewards earned unless they are part of those listed above.

GSCB suggests that the troop collectively makes this choice before **February 7, 2025**, and completes the Opt Out in eBudde so that you do not miss out on any proceeds during an ACH.

GSCB will NOT credit any troops that do not opt out before the provided deadline so be sure to hold this conversation with your troop as early as possible if they qualify and make the adjustment in your troop's Settings tab.

Using eBudde to Pickup Your Cookie Cupboard Order

A registered cookie pick-up person must pickup cookies from a Cupboard after a pending order is placed in eBudde by the Troop Cookie Champion (TCC). You can have more than one pickup person in your troop.

The TCC is automatically made a registered pickup person. You can identify other trusted troop volunteers as "Cookie Pick-Up Only Users" by completing the <u>Troop Pickup Only User Request</u> form online with the volunteer's name, their actively used email address and your troop number. Following the volunteer's submission of a troop pickup volunteer, next steps will be emailed to the volunteer to setup their eBudde account. Their account must be setup prior to their scheduled pickup at all council cupboards.

National Delegate Applications are now being accepted through January 31st!

What does a National Delegate do?

National Council Delegates are elected to three-year terms and serve as your council's voting members on the National Council. Throughout their three-year term, they gather feedback from members of your council, learn about proposals, and act as your council's voice while attending the National Council Session. Delegates share insights and report on actions taken by the National Council with your membership at your council's Annual Meeting and other council events. Here is the <u>National Delegate</u> <u>Position Description</u> to learn more about the responsibilities.

What is the National Council Session?

This special gathering only happens once every three years where delegates from around the country and overseas gather to vote on and discuss issues important to our Movement, and elect leaders for the next triennium. After NCS, thousands more Girl Scouts (and alums, families, and non-members) stream into town for a multi-day event featuring interactive workshops, inspiring speakers, and once-in-a-lifetime adventures that spark forever friendships.

That sounds AMAZING! How do I apply to be a National Delegate?

- Applicants must meet the following criteria: Must maintain membership with GSCB during the application process and throughout their 3 year term
- Must be a citizen of the United States and be 14 years of age or older
- Must successfully complete the volunteer screening process including background checks, and be in good standing with GSCB

If selected, virtual interviews will be scheduled for early February. The Board Development Committee will finalize the selection process in March 2025.

Those elected to this term will serve from 7/1/25 - 6/30/28 and will attend the National Council Session in July of 2026.
